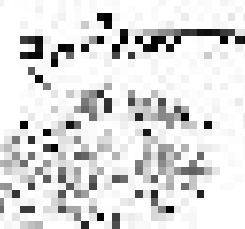

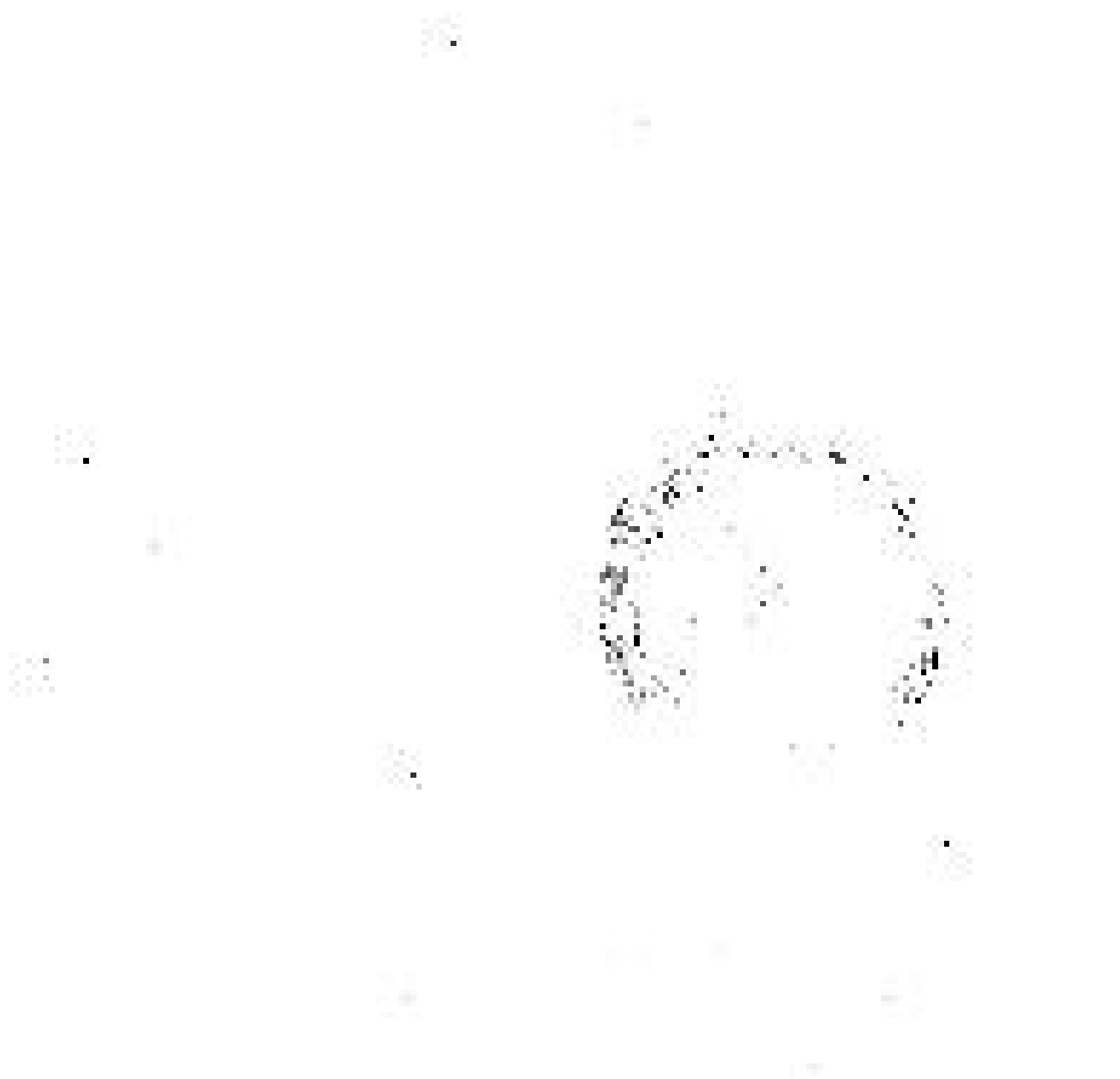

ARTICLE 10

ACADEMIC FREEDOM

10-100

1. The University shall protect the academic freedom of its faculty in their teaching, research, and creative activities. This freedom shall be exercised within the bounds of the University's mission and the standards of the academic community.

2. The University shall not interfere with the academic freedom of its faculty in their teaching, research, or creative activities. This includes the right to express their views on matters of public concern, provided that such expression is not defamatory, obscene, or otherwise in violation of the law.

3. The University shall not discriminate against its faculty on the basis of race, ethnicity, gender, religion, or political affiliation in its academic activities. This includes the right to hold and express opinions on matters of public concern, provided that such expression is not defamatory, obscene, or otherwise in violation of the law.

4. The University shall not discipline its faculty for their academic activities. This includes the right to hold and express opinions on matters of public concern, provided that such expression is not defamatory, obscene, or otherwise in violation of the law.
