**SECTION 1: THE HISTORY OF THE UNITED STATES**

**UNITED STATES HISTORY**

The United States was founded in 1776 as a collection of thirteen colonies. The colonies were established by British settlers who sought religious freedom and economic opportunity. The American Revolution (1775-1783) was a war for independence from British rule, resulting in the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776 and the Constitution in 1787.
